Independent Overnight Parking Policy



September 2004

Central Otago welcomes you. We hope you enjoy your stay in the district and get the opportunity to experience the great outdoors, the fine food and wine and our breathtaking landscapes.

We ask you to observe the following rules.

Rules

The Central Otago District Council recognises that overnight camping is part of the New Zealand way of life.

We encourage campers in tents and vans to use the camping grounds. Check out our website or Visitor Information Centres for more details.

- Overnight parking will be permitted on all Council land except the areas stated in Schedule 1.
- Do not park in the vicinity of a registered camping ground or try to use their facilities.
- Only self-contained motor vehicles that are fitted with a three-day capacity toilet and wastewater holding facility are permitted to camp overnight.
- Overnight parking will only be allowed at any one location for a maximum of two nights in any given calendar month.
- Toilet and wastewater must be disposed of at a Council approved Dump Station; these are detailed in Schedule 2.
Note: There may be a charge.
- All dogs must be controlled at all times, complying with our Dog Policy. Where a dog is considered to be creating a nuisance in an overnight camping environment, the owner will be asked to move on.
- Campers must adhere to safe fire practices and be aware of fire risks, especially during the summer season. Purpose built fireplaces and portable BBQ's are to be used for outside cooking.
