 September 1896

- Letter from James Truesdale (?) drawing attention to the road passing Duck's (?) Hotel. They have fenced off the old road and the road left to go on is impassable -= 22 July 1895
- Letter from another Lauder resident complaining about the fence Duck's has placed across the road to bring the traffic passed his bar 22 July 1895
- Letter from Mr Paget and Party requesting that a portion of the road on the west side of the Molyneux between Robert's gate and Chapman Gully near Poverty Beach be shifted back to enable them to work their payable wash – 14 November 1890
- Letter from Thomas Sims, Ranger, reporting to the County that a Mr Williams has fenced off a large vicinity of Simetary Gully which has also enclosed the road n.d.
- Letter from Mr Arthur complaining that it was near impossible to get access from his farm, block 6 Leaning Rock to the main road to Alexandra due to a large race over which there is no culvert – 20 November 1884
- Memorandum from the county engineer to the county chairman forwarding a letter of complaint from William Olds, ranger of the Cromwell Commonage, regarding fencing of roads leading from the low to the high country – 12 December 1882
