RULES OF THE MANIOTOTO JOCKEY CLUB.

(Registered)

Adopted at a meeting of the members of the Club held on Saturday the Eighth day of June 1907.

- NAME OF CLUB: Maniototo Jockey Club (Registered).
- OBJECTS: For the carrying on and conducting the sport of racing near the Township of Naseby.
- APPLICATION OF FUNDS: To provide prizes for the horses winning the various events to be competed for and paying expenses of and incidental thereto.
- MEMBERS: Members shall consist of ordinary, honorary and life members.
The annual subscription for ordinary members shall be \$1-1/- per annum.
Honorary and life members shall pay no subscription.
- ELECTION OF NEW MEMBERS: New members shall be proposed and seconded by a members of the Club and shall be deemed elected if they receive a majority in votes of the members present.
- MAKING RULES ETC: New rules may be made or existing rules altered and rescinded at any ordinary meeting of members provided seven clear days notice shall have been given of intention to make alter or rescind rules.
- MEETINGS: Ordinary meetings shall be held at such

times as occasion may require and may be convened either by a circular addressed to each member or by advertisement in some paper circulating in the Naseby District. Special Meetings may be convened by order of the Committee or by a requisition in writing signed by at least seven members stating the purpose for which the meeting is required.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT: Committee of Management shall consist of President, Vice-President and Treasurer and six members of the Club who shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Club which shall be held on the First Tuesday in August in each year.

APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS: Officers shall consist of President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Auditor and shall be appointed by a majority of the members present at the annual meeting of the members of the Club and any officer or member of committee may be removed at any meeting of the members on a resolution carried by a majority of those present.

CONTROL OF FUNDS: The committee of Management shall have sole control over the funds and the investment thereof.

COMMON SEAL: The Common Seal of the Club shall consist of an imprint in a circle of the words Maniototo Jockey Club (registered) and the Seal shall be under the control of the Committee of Management and may be affixed to any documents by the President and the Secretary.

EXPULSION OF MEMBERS: Every person shall cease to be a member of the Club who shall fail or neglect to pay his annual subscription or shall fail to

observe any rule of the Club for the time being in force or shall be guilty of any misconduct which in the opinion of the majority of the members of the Club shall justify expulsion or shall be disqualified by any racing club for breach of any of the regulations or rules of racing for the time being in force.

DISSOLUTION OF THE CLUB: The Club may be dissolved upon a resolution to that effect being carried by a majority of the members present at a special meeting called for that purpose and the property of the Club shall be disposed off as such majority or any sub-committee appointed by such majority may decide.

WE the undersigned President Three members of the Committee and the Secretary of the Maniototo Jockey Club (registered) do hereby certify that the foregoing are the Rules of the Maniototo Jockey Club (registered) and that the same were adopted at a general meeting of the members of the said Club held at Naseby on Saturday the Eighth day of June One thousand nine hundred and seven.

IN WITNESS whereof we have hereunto affixed the Seal of the Maniototo Jockey Club (registered) and have hereunto subscribed our names this *Eleventh* day of *June* 1907.

Rules and Regulations
- of the -
Maniototo Jockey Club

Club shall be called the "Maniototo Jockey Club" and shall consist of all persons, not disqualified punters, who have been duly elected or shall hereafter be duly elected Members, in the manner after provided.

Candidates for admission as members of the Club shall be proposed and seconded by members in meeting, and if the meeting so desires the election shall be made by ballot, if not a show of hands shall be considered sufficient.

The Annual subscription shall be ^{One guinea} payable in advance on the ^{1st day of August} 1st of November in each year and shall entitle members to free admission to any part of the Club's grounds & stand at any meeting held during the year.

No person shall be entitled to vote on any business in which he is interested, unless he is a member, and no person shall enjoy any of the privileges of a member until he shall have paid his subscription.

The Annual Meeting of the Club shall be held on ^{the 1st day of August} the 1st day of November in each year for the purpose of:-

(a) Receiving the report of the outgoing committee and Treasurer's Balance Sheet.

(b) Electing the President, ^{vice President Treasurer} Committee and Auditors for the ensuing year.

(c) The transaction of ordinary & general business meeting to be convened by Circular addressed ~~to each member.~~ ^{to each member or by advertisement}

Special Meetings may be convened by order of Committee, or by a requisition in writing addressed to the Secretary signed by at least

(7) members, stating the purpose for which required, and only the business for which Special Meeting is called shall be transacted.

(4) At all General Meetings five (5) members form a quorum. Should there not be a quorum the members present shall adjourn the meeting to such time as they may deem advisable.

At all meetings the President shall if present take the Chair. If he is absent the members present shall elect a chairman.

The affairs and general business of the Club shall be managed by a Committee consisting of the President, ^{vice President Treasurer} and 6 members to be elected by the General Meetings who shall retire annually but

be for re-election

The Committee shall appoint a Secretary ~~whose name shall be set off as a member of~~ the Committee.

The Committee shall meet as often as may be necessary to transact the business of the Club (4) To form a quorum, & minutes of their proceedings shall be entered in a book, to be kept by the Secretary & read and confirmed at the next meeting.

The Committee shall have the appointment of Bankers and all officers and servants of the Club and shall allow such salaries to them respectively as they shall from time to time deem fit.

The Committee shall have full power to appoint Stewards, Judge, Starter, Clerk of the Course, Handicapper or Handicappers, to enter into contracts on behalf of the Club, to dispose of the property of the Club as they may deem best for furthering the interests of the Club to prepare and issue programmes for race meetings to be held during the year, to make the regulations under which the races at any meeting are to be run, to make such alterations as they may think proper in regard to the course and the conditions of the races.

To postpone the date of any meeting on account of any unforeseen circumstances from time to time as they may think proper.

14. All questions brought before the Committee shall be decided by a majority of the votes given by those present at any meeting.

Stewards

15. The duties of the Committee in respect to the general management of the business of the Race-Course at each meeting shall devolve upon the Stewards from one (1) week prior to each meeting down to one (1) week subsequent thereto during which time upon the Race-Course and upon all matters connected immediately with the Races the Stewards authority shall be supreme and their decision in all cases final.

16. The Stewards shall be protected by the Club against any legal proceedings that may be instituted against their decisions provided they act in accordance with the Rules and by-laws of the Club.

16^a The President, Judge, Clerk of the Course, and ^{clerk of scales} starter shall be ex-officio Stewards of all race meetings held during their year of office.

Secretary & Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary and Treasurer to keep full and accurate accounts of sums of money received or expended on behalf of the Club. To make full and accurate minutes in books of the proceedings of all general meetings, or Committee meetings. To give notices of meetings stating business, and subject to the directions of the Committee to make all disbursements from funds of the Club by cheque. To obtain receipts for same and to carry out the instructions of the Committee or Stewards.

Privileges

The right to the various privileges of the Club shall be sold by auction on such day as may be determined most convenient, to be not less than 3 weeks prior to each race meeting. The conditions which each privilege shall be offered to be sold by the Committee before-hand, and the Clerk instructed accordingly.

No person shall be invited to partake of the dinner on the Course, by any single person, unless the invitor pays the booth-owner regulation price for such visitors dinner by

The Stewards, shall have power, in meeting assembled, to authorise the Secretary to issue a written invitation to any person or persons they may wish to show the compliment to, to dine with them, and in such case only shall the Club be liable to defray the cost of such dinner. The Booth owner to be instructed not to admit any person other than a Steward without either such invitation or cash payment, by the inviting Steward.

- Totalisator -

20. Subject to the arrangements made by the Committee the Totalisator shall be worked by Two (2) clerks, or other persons duly appointed who shall in each and every case, before paying out on any race hand to the Secretary a list showing the number of investors on each horse and the dividend proposed to be paid and the Secretary shall thereupon, ascertain the correctness of such proposed dividend before authorising the persons working the Totalisator to pay out.
